Rules of Procedure

The United Nations Security Council at LUMUN XVI shall follow the following standard MUN Rules of Procedure with the following additions:

Public Directives: The Council may pass public directives in order to take an action with respect to the issue they have been discussing. A public directive requires a simple majority to pass. Each of the Permanent Five nations has a right to exercise a veto over any public directive.

Private Directives: Delegates, via private communication to the dais, can use the resources and abilities at the disposal of the nations they represent to influence the crisis, contingent upon acceptance by the dais.

Crisis Updates: Public updates to the crisis at hand will be announced to the entire Council. Personal updates will be communicated to specific delegates by the dais. The dais can use crisis updates to influence the direction of the committee but will attempt to give the delegates as much autonomy in deciding the direction of the committee via press releases and speeches within committee. Crisis updates can also be based on or inspired from discussions/speeches in the council.

Press Releases: The Council may collectively formulate a press release with no specific format, to make available to the media. These would only possess signatories. Once approved by the dais, a press release can be passed by simple majority.



Summons: At appropriate times during the conference, the Council may summon a personality/representative external to the council for a Question and Answer session, contingent upon approval from the dais.
